The Cannonball House, named for damage sustained during the War Between the States, was built in 1853 as a planter's townhouse. Located in Macon, Georgia, The Cannonball House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. It is an example of authentic Greek Revival architecture containing fine period furnishings. The house is also the repository for the Founders' parlors of the Adelphean (AΔTI) and Philomathean (ΦM) societies, recreated from Wesleyan College, where they began in 1851 and 1852. One of Georgia's most historic homes and distinguished structures, the Johnston-Felton-Hay House in Macon was declared a National Historic Landmark in 1974. Construction began in 1855 and continued into 1859. The House was built in the Italian Renaissance Revival style, a marked contrast to the Greek Revival architecture of the Antebellum period.
